Geocaching With Dad Treasure Hunt / Beginner's GPS Navigation Training Course at Sacred Rocks Reserve, Saturday, June 20, Offers Wallet Friendly Outdoor Adventure for Father's Day Weekend



What: Sacred Rocks Reserve's Geocaching With Dad Treasure Hunt and Beginning GPS Navigation Training Course for sons, daughters and dads of all ages.

When: Saturday, June 20, 2009. Geocaching Treasure Hunt will be held from 9 am until noon. The Beginning GPS Navigation Training Course (recommended for beginners) will be

held at 8:30 am on the same day, right before the Geocaching Treasure Hunt begins. Horseshoe Tournament will be held from 1:00 - 4:00 pm on Saturday afternoon.

Where: Sacred Rocks Reserve and RV Park, 1331 Shasta Way, Boulevard, CA, 91905. Less than 60 miles east of San Diego along Interstate 8.



Who: Bring dad for the day on Saturday, or make a weekend get-away for the entire Father's Day weekend.

Open to the families of all ages -- children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult. RV, tent campers and day visitors are welcome.

Cost: Geocaching Treasure Hunt is \$5 for "Daytripper" Geocachers, plus site fees for tent and RV campers. Participants must bring their own GPS Receiver or iPhone. **Discounted site fees, two nights for the price of one, available this event weekend only.** At 5 pm Saturday, an evening hotdog roast with chips, drinks and marshmallows to toast is available for an additional \$5 per person.

Boulevard, CA - **Sacred Rocks Reserve and RV Park**, a 163-acre wilderness reserve with RV and tent camping sites, is offering a Geocaching With Dad Treasure Hunt and Beginning GPS Navigation Training Course for families of all ages, on Saturday, June 20, 2009. A Horseshoe Tournament will follow from 1:00 - 4:00

pm, on the same day – guests are encouraged to pack a picnic lunch and spend the entire day with dad.

“Geocaching” is an outdoor treasure hunting game where participants use a global positioning system (GPS) or other navigational techniques to hide and seek containers or caches containing treasures.” (Wikipedia). Participants in Sacred Rocks’ three hour Geocaching With Dad Treasure Hunt will compete with other Geocachers to find the six caches, hidden on the 163-acre property. The Beginning GPS Navigation Training Course will be a brief, half-hour course beginning at 8:30 am on Saturday morning, and will cover the basics of using GPS navigation devices and pre-set coordinates to find hidden caches.

“We had such a great response to our Geocaching Easter Egg Hunt in April,” says Sharon Courmouis, co-owner of Sacred Rocks. “We thought this would be a fun, outdoor adventure for kids and dads of all ages who want to enjoy doing something different together on Father’s Day weekend,” she adds. The park is 58 miles east of San Diego -- the round-trip to Sacred Rocks can be made on less than a tank of gas from San Diego or Imperial Valley.

A campfire and hotdog roast will be available Saturday evening at 5 pm, for an additional \$5 per person. Open access to the reserve’s hiking trails and outdoor labyrinth will be available throughout the weekend.

Sacred Rocks is located near Boulevard, California, approximately 65 miles East of San Diego along Interstate 8, at the head of the Pacific Crest Trail. **Sacred Rocks Reserve is located at 1331 Shasta Way in Boulevard, California, 91905. Sacred Rocks RV Park (formerly Outdoor World RV Park) is situated within ***Sacred Rocks Reserve***, a 163-acre wilderness playground for RV enthusiasts, campers, hikers, nature lovers and retreat seekers. The park also offers a 100-foot outdoor labyrinth (the largest in California) laid out on the ground in an ancient form, which provides a place to walk or meditate. Other historic and outdoor activities within a short drive include the San Diego Historic Train museum and the scenic village of Tecate, Mexico. 151 extra large RV sites with complete hookup facilities are available, as well as a tent camping area, bunkhouse, general store, clubhouse, shower facilities and Wifi service.
